(Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Uganda and Kenya 2023-25)

Call for applications for 2 study grants and welcome services for refugee students eligible for admission to English taught master's degrees at University of Catania 2023-2024 a.y.

Application period: from 3rd April 2023 to 19th May 2023

ART. 1

Goals

The general aim of the project named **University Corridors for Refugees - UNICORE 5.0** (Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Uganda and Kenya 2023-25) is to promote the refugees' right to higher education through university corridors from Niger, Nigeria and Cameroon to Italy. The project is jointly promoted by a consortium:

- United nations High commissioner for refugees (UNHCR)
- Italian Ministry for foreign affairs and international cooperation (MAECI)
- Caritas Italiana
- Centro Astalli – JRS Jesuits service for refugees in Italy
- Diaconia Valdese
- Gandhi Charity
- Italian universities listed in the National cooperation agreement.

The University of Catania supports the project and offers two scholarships for students admitted to one of the master degree courses listed in article 1.1.

The call will be published on the University website www.unict.it and in the project page www.unict.it/it/didattica/unicore-university-corridors-refugees

The English version of the call has been drafted exclusively for purposes of publicity. For call implementation, dispute resolution and for all legal purposes, only the Italian version is valid.

The official approval of the UNICORE 5.0 National cooperation agreement is currently underway.

ART. 1.1

List of English taught master's degrees participating in the initiative

The project addresses to candidates with refugee status living in Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Uganda and Kenya that want to enroll in one of the following English taught master's degrees (two years) at University of Catania for 2023/2024 academic year:



- LM -17 Physics
- LM -22 Chemical Engineering for Industrial Sustainability
- LM -25 Automation Engineering
- LM -27 Communications Engineering
- LM -28 Electrical Engineering for Sustainable Green Energy Transition
- LM -62 Global Politics and Euro-Mediterranean Relations (Glopem)

Scholarships and benefits will be awarded for 2023/2024 a.y. and for 2024/2025 a.y. Requirements for scholarships and benefits renewal are indicated under art. 6.

ART. 2

Local Partners of the Project

ART. 2.1

Benefits and supports offered to winners

The two winners will be awarded scholarships and benefits as follows:

- Full coverage of expenses to be faced before arriving in Italy: flight tickets, costs for getting visa and costs involved in preparing documents concerning foreign academic qualifications (CARITAS Italiana and UNHCR);
- Italian language course of 40 hours, free of charge, delivered online in synchronous mode by University



for foreigners of Siena, Perugia and University of Notre Dame in July / August 2023;

- Yearly scholarship of € 5.000,00
- Exemption from university contribution;
- Accommodation in university residences;
- Meals;
- Senior students Tutorship, aiming at supporting administrative procedures, learning activities and inclusion in the students' community;
- Counselling for enrollment procedures by O.U International Relations -International students' admission Unit;
- Support and full coverage of expenses for the procedures related to the issuance of Italian study permit (both first application and renewal) over the standard duration of the master's degree;
- Support and full costs coverage for the procedures related to registration in Italian health care system over the standard duration of the master's degree;
- Free of charge registration in Italian language courses organized by the School of Italian Language and Culture of the University of Catania in the 2022/2024 period;
- Transport pass;
- Further support services – for example psychological counselling, cultural and linguistic mediation, legal assistance, mentoring, tutoring, social and cultural activities.

ART. 2.2

Incompatibility

The UNICORE 5.0 scholarships cannot be combined with:

- Merit-based or income-based grants / prizes offered by University of Catania;
- Study grants issued by Italian Ministry for foreign affairs and international cooperation (MAECI);
- CRUI grants for holders of international protection;
- Scholarships addressing to international students and issued by foreign governments and bodies upon agreements with University of Catania;
- Regional scholarships (ERSU);

ART. 3

Admission requirements

Application is open only to candidates who meet the following requirements:

1. Are residing in Niger, Nigeria, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Uganda and Kenya and have been recognized refugee status in these countries;
2. Hold a qualification valid for admission to the chosen Second Cycle Degree Programme. The qualification must have been issued by a higher education institution accredited in the higher education system of the Country



where the degree has been issued;

3. The qualification must as well consent the access to a second level degree course in the country of issuance;
4. Hold a qualification not being obtained before 2018 and by 31.07.2023;
5. Have a GPA (Grade point average) of at least 3.0 corresponding to, at least, 24/30 – referred to the Italian System. For the conversion of the average to the Italian grading system it will be used the official conversion formula of the Italian Ministry of Education, as for Annex 2 of this call;
6. Meet specific curricular requirements and, in accordance with the provisions established by Italian Ministerial Decree n. 270/2004, have an adequate educational background, for the program of interest, as further specified in each course information sheet provided in the Annexes;
7. Not being previously registered in an academic study programme at University of Catania or at any other Italian university member of UNICORE 5.0 consortium;
8. Have an adequate English language knowledge (B2 level).

ART.4

Admission board and application

Art.4.1 Admission board

Students are selected on merit-based criteria.

Assessment will be performed by the admission board officially appointed by Rectoral Decree.

The admission board will be composed by the Professors in charge of the Master Programmes concerned (or their delegates) and a member of the O.U. International Relations.

The admission board will be supported by any other teaching staff considered appropriate.

The admission board, according to the selection criteria, will issue a female and a male ranking in order to guarantee equal access opportunities. If there will be no candidates representatives of the two genders the available scholarships will be awarded to two candidates of the same gender.

With the same score, the younger candidate comes first.

Art.4.2

Application form and attachments

Candidates must submit the following scanned documents in Italian or English language (documents translated by candidates are accepted at application step):

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS:

1. Signed application form (use the attached form, only);
2. Valid *Refugee Identity card* issued in cooperation with UNHCR or valid *PoR Card*;
3. A Certificate confirming the qualification required for admission to the chosen degree course or, if the qualification has not yet been obtained, a certificate of enrollment from the University stating the expected date



of graduation;

4. Transcript of exams passed and marks obtained;
5. Detailed and signed Curriculum vitae;
6. A Certificate or self-declaration about English language proficiency.

NOT MANDATORY DOCUMENTS:

7. A motivation letter (max two A4 pages) or a short video-CV (candidates can use their mobile phone for recording it), where they introduce themselves and explain their motivations;
8. Letter/s of reference written by supervisor / advisor supporting the application.

Art.4.3

Applications submission

Candidates have to send the duly signed application form attached to this call, along with the mandatory documents listed in paragraph 4.2.

Applications must be sent via email to unicore@unict.it from 3rd April 2023 to 19th May (noon, UTC+1).

The email must have as its object: UNICORE 5.0 - name and surname of the candidate

Applications will not be accepted if they are incomplete and / or are sent without the required documents and / or are received after the deadline.

Candidates can apply for

- one master's degree only held at University of Catania
- no more than two universities that are partners in the project UNICORE 5.0: if two universities are selected, candidates will have to present a different admission requests to each University and must indicate the order of priority.

ART.5

Selection process

The selection process will be performed in two steps:

- Step 1: assessment of CV and documents concerning foreign qualification
- Step 2: online interview

Art.5.1

First step: assessment of received documents

The admission board will evaluate documents according to the following criteria:

- Academic background and GPA (score range: 0-15)
- Curriculum Vitae: evaluation of personal skills and professional experience (score range: 0-15)
- Coherence between previous studies and selected Master's Degree (score range: 0-10)

The maximum score assigned in the first step will be 40 points.



At the end of Step 1 two provisional rankings will be published, according to the gender of the candidates, and only **the first 3 candidates of each ranking will be admitted to Step 2 (online interview)**. In the case that one of the lists of eligible candidates does not include enough representatives it will be possible to admit to Step 2 more than 3 representatives of the same gender up to the maximum of 6 candidates.

Candidates admitted to Step 2 will be notified by email; the provisional ranking list will be also published on www.unict.it. and in the project page www.unict.it/it/didattica/unicore-university-corridors-refugees

Art.5.2

Second step: on-line interview

Candidates admitted to Step 2 will be interviewed by the admission board, who will evaluate their academic and technical skills, competence on the subject as well as their mastering of the English language.

Interviews will be graded on a scale of 40 points and will be scheduled on-line from 22 May to 7 July 2023.

Candidates will be notified by email about the date and time of the interview.

At the beginning of the interview candidates will have to show the *Refugee Identity Card* or *PoR Card* sent along with the application form.

Art.5.3

Preparation of the final ranking list

The two available scholarships are awarded on a gender balance ratio and the admission board will elaborate two different final rankings according to the gender of the candidates. Only in the case that the list of eligible candidates does not include representatives of the two genders, the scholarships can be awarded to two representatives of the same gender.

Candidates who will score less than 50/80 points will not be included in the final ranking.

Candidate rankings are drawn up by the admission board summing up the results of the two phases and are approved by Rectoral Decree.

The ranking is organised in decreasing order of points.

For equal points, preference will be given to the younger candidate.

The winners will be notified by email **within 12th July 2023** and the **final ranking list will be also published on www.unict.it** and in the project page www.unict.it/it/didattica/unicore-university-corridors-refugees

Art.5.4

Acceptance

In order to confirm scholarship acceptance, candidates must reply to the university email within 10 days from receipt. Failing to provide feedback by the deadline will cause the loss of admission and financial benefits.

By accepting the scholarship, candidates fully accept without reservations UNICORE 5.0 project support and financial benefits at the conditions indicated in this call.

Upon acceptance, candidates also confirm under their responsibility that they do not fall under any of the



conditions of incompatibility established in the article 2 of this call.

Art.5.5

Ranking scroll and assignment of available seats

In case a candidate winner of the scholarship will officially withdraw the scholarship will be allocated to the next eligible candidate in the ranking.

In case of vacant seat the University of Catania reserves the right to search for eligible candidates from rankings of other University partners. Eligible candidates from external rankings must meet the specific requirement of the programmes of University of Catania.

ART.6

Scholarships

ART. 6.1

Scholarship payment

For the first year, 50% of the scholarship will be paid within 45 days from when the bank account details will be notified by the student to the O.U International Relations -International students, the remaining 50% will be paid within 45 days upon achievement of 9 credits.

Only in the event of difficulty in opening a bank account the scholarship will be paid in cash in deferred installments of € 833,33.

The scholarship for the second year will be paid in a lump sum upon enrollment in the a.y. 2024/2025 after verifying the achievement of the ECTS required by art. 6.2;

ART. 6.2

Renewal

Scholarship will be renewed provided that students will gain, by 30th September 2024, at least 30 CFUs.

Students are required to graduate by the last session available for their matriculation year, i.e. April 2026.

ART. 6.3

Additional Renewal

Students who do not succeed to graduate within April 2026 can request a 6 months extension of the scholarship (for the amount of € 2.500,00), provided they have earned at least 80 CFUs by 31 March 2026.

Extension request must be submitted to the O.U International Relations -International students.

ART. 6.4

Tax treatment

To scholarships is applicable the exemption provided by art.3, paragraph 3, letter d-ter of the TUIR which set the exclusion from the Irpef taxable base of the sums paid as scholarship by the Italian Government to foreign citizens



according to international agreements and understandings.

ART.7

Enrollment

Information concerning procedures and deadline for enrollment will be sent to the winners by the O.U International Relations -International students' admission Unit.

Document required for enrollment are as follows:

- original diploma (or replacement certificate) concerning the foreign academic degree achieved, in Italian or English language, legalized by the authorities in the country of issuance and Declaration of value issued by the Italian Diplomatic Office in the Country where the qualification was awarded;
- transcript with the list of exams taken and relevant marks, in Italian or English language, legalized by the authorities in the country of issuance.

Instead of Legalization and Declaration of value, University of Catania accepts respectively the Statement of verification and the Statement of comparability issued by CIMEA Italian Board.

Candidates must also submit study visa and travel documents suitable for entering Italy and for temporary residence, pursuant to current Italian regulations.

ART.8

Withdrawal

Students who will withdraw from the study programme after enrollment will lose all the benefits.

ART.9

Protection of personal data

The processing of personal data provided by candidates for the aforementioned purposes is carried out by the University of Catania, as Data Controller, in compliance with the principles laid down by art. 5 of the EU Regulation - GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation).

Data must be provided for evaluation of the participation requirements, under penalty of exclusion from the selection procedure.

Legal basis of the processing art. 6 par. 1. lett. b and e), art. 9 par. 2. lett. g) of the GPDR, as identified by art. 2-sexies lett. e) and bb) of Legislative Decree 196/2003 (as amended by Legislative Decree 2018/101).

The data provided by candidates will be processed by means of appropriate guarantees and security measures - manual and / or electronic, in order to ensure their protection, confidentiality and integrity.

Personal data will be processed by University personnel duly authorized and instructed by the Data Controller.



Physics (Italian Code LM – 17)

Curricular and educational background requirements

In order to be admitted to this course of study, applicants are expected to meet specific curricular requirements and have the following knowledge and skills:

- a) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad obtained since no more than six years. Undergraduates candidates can be also accepted providing that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023;
- b) An adequate academic background in Physics and Mathematics which includes a introductory course in quantum mechanics.

Language requirements:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.



Chemical Engineering for Industrial Sustainability (*Italian Code LM-22*)

Curricular and educational background requirements

To be admitted to this course of study applicants are expected to meet specific curricular requirements and have the knowledge and abilities as follows:

- a) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad. Undergraduates candidates are also accepted providing that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023;
- b) Successful applicants come primarily from an academic background in:
 - a. chemical engineering,
 - b. petroleum engineering;
 - c. chemistry;
 - d. industrial chemistry;
 - e. industrial engineering;
 - f. mechanical engineering;
 - g. civil engineering;
 - h. environmental engineering;
 - i. materials engineering.

Candidates may also be seconded from international organisations and national foreign services, provided they hold a university degree and have relevant professional experience compatible with the academic background required to enrol in the Degree Programme in Chemical Engineering for Industrial Sustainability (LM22).

Language requirement:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.



Automation Engineering and Control of Complex Systems (*Italian Code LM-25*)

Curricular and educational background requirements:

To be admitted to this course of study applicants are expected to meet specific curricular requirements and have the knowledge and abilities as follows.

- a) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad. Undergraduates candidates are also accepted providing that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023.
- b) An adequate knowledge in basic subjects as mathematical and numerical analysis, linear algebra and geometry, probability and statistics, physics, chemistry.
- c) An adequate knowledge in the subjects specific of the degree course as informatics, control and systems theory, electronics, information processing.
- d) The ability to use methodological and operational aspects of mathematics and other basic sciences to describe engineering problems.

Successful applicants come primarily from an academic background in the following Engineering fields: Automation, Electronics, Computer Science, Telecommunication, Electrical, Mechanical and Industrial.

The level of the basic and subject specific knowledge will be evaluated by the student transcript in terms of ECTS acquired and course marks. The methodological abilities will be evaluated by the course projects carried out during the student career or equivalent experiences.

Language requirements:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.



Communications Engineering (Italian Code LM-27)

Curricular and educational background requirements:

To be admitted to this course of study applicants are expected to meet specific curricular and educational requirements as follows:

- a) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad. Nongraduated candidates are also accepted provided that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023.
- b) An adequate knowledge in basic subjects such as mathematical and numerical analysis, linear algebra and geometry, probability and statistics, physics and chemistry.
- c) An adequate knowledge in the subjects specific of the course such as analog and digital communications, networking, electronics, computer engineering and programming, system theory.
- d) The ability to use methodological and operational aspects of mathematics and other basic sciences and to describe engineering problems.

Successful candidates have mainly an academic background in the following engineering fields: Electronic Engineering, Telecommunication Engineering, Automation Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Computer Engineering and Computer Science.

Language requirement:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.



*Electrical Engineering for Sustainable Green Energy Transition
(Italian Code LM-28)*

Curricular and educational background requirements

To be admitted to this course of study applicants are expected to meet specific curricular requirements and have the knowledge and abilities as follows:

- e) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad. Undergraduates candidates are also accepted providing that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023;
- f) Successful applicants come primarily from an academic background in:
 - Electrical Engineering;
 - Electronics Engineering;
 - Industrial Engineering.

Candidates may also be seconded from international organisations and national foreign services, provided they hold a university degree and have relevant professional experience.

- g) an adequate knowledge in basic subjects as mathematical and numerical analysis, linear algebra and geometry, physics, chemistry, informatics, control and systems theory.

Language requirement:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.



Global Politics and Euro-Mediterranean Relations (Italian Code LM-62)

Curricular and educational background requirements

To be admitted to this course of study applicants are expected to meet specific curricular requirements and have the knowledge and abilities as follows:

- a) A bachelor's or higher degree awarded abroad. Undergraduates candidates are also accepted providing that they will obtain their bachelor's degree before 31 July 2023;
- b) Successful applicants come primarily from an academic background in:
 - a. Political Science, EU studies, International Relations, Diplomatic Studies, Area Studies, Development studies;
 - b. Cultural and social studies, Humanities and history, Communication studies, Modern Languages;
 - c. International and/or EU law, international and /or EU economics.

Candidates that hold a University degree with different academic background may also be considered if they are seconded from international organisations and national foreign services, and have relevant professional experience.

Language requirement:

Candidates who wish to register in the master's programme need to have good English language skills, both written and spoken. A B2 level or higher of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) for languages is required.

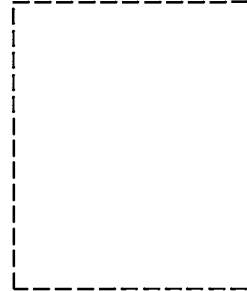

GRADE: $G - G_{\min} / G_{\max} - G_{\min} * (I_{\max} - I_{\min}) + I_{\min}$
